### I WILL LEAVE THE WILDERNESS AS I FOUND IT

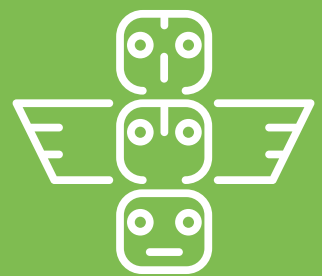


Be thoughtful of how you interact with the wilderness.

## INDIGENOUS CULTURES

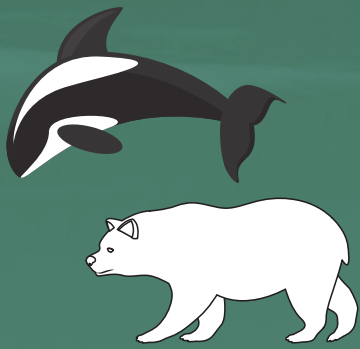
### I WILL RESPECT INDIGENOUS AND LOCAL CULTURES

## IMPACTS AND THREATS

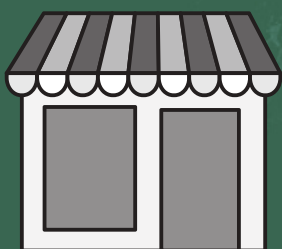
### I WILL BE INQUISITIVE ABOUT THE WILDERNESS
